GOVERNORS ASK FOR \$1 TRILLION IN FEDERAL ASSISTANCE

Five Democratic governors, including Ohio Governor Ted Strickland, have asked Congress and President-Elect Obama for \$1 trillion in federal assistance. During a conference call with reporters Governor Strickland talked about Ohio's possible \$7.3 billion shortfall in the next biennial budget. The Governor said that without federal assistance Ohio would have to take a 25% across-the-board cut in state government operations to balance the next budget. The five governors asked for a stimulus and rescue package that would be divided into \$250 billion in education grants, \$250 billion for programs such as Medicaid and unemployment compensation, \$350 billion for infrastructure projects, and \$150 billion for middle-class tax cuts. NIDA RELEASES REPORT ON COMORBIDITY

The National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA) released a research report, *Comorbidity: Addiction and Other Mental Illnesses*, this week. The report summarizes the state of the science regarding the relationship between substance abuse and other mental disorders. For 20 years national surveys have shown a high prevalence of drug abuse among individuals diagnosed with other mental illnesses. This research report describes common factors that can lead to comorbidity and it highlights some of the challenges to concurrently treating these conditions. SAMHSA RELEASES REPORT ON SERIOUS PSYCHOLOGICAL DISTRESS

The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) has released a report showing that an estimated 24.3 million people ages 18 and older have experienced serious psychological distress in the past year, however only 44.6% of them received mental health services. The report also found that the rate of serious psychological distress was higher among young adults ages 18 to 25.
